WHEREAS the Parties confirm their commitment to a relationship that is based on mutual respect and understanding;

AND WHEREAS the Parties recognize that to achieve a climate of ongoing cooperation and stability in the fisheries, subsequent agreements entered into pursuant to this Agreement will be discussed in a context of information gathering and exchange with other user groups whose interests may be affected;

NOW THEREFORE the Parties agree as follows:

2.0 <u>Purpose</u>

The purpose of this Agreement is to provide a general framework for discussions with respect to matters set out in section 3.0 of this Agreement.

3.0 <u>Scope of Discussions</u>

3.1 The Parties agree to enter into discussions in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement with respect to the following matters related to the conservation, protection and management of fisheries used by the Constituents:

(a) identification of what constitutes the fisheries used by the Constituents;

- (b) fisheries management;
- (c) allocation;
- (d) administration of enforcement;
- (e) all aspects of an Aboriginal fishery including fish for food, social and ceremonial purposes and disposition;
- (f) mechanisms to resolve disputes between the Parties in both the framework and substantive stages of discussions and with respect to the implementation of subsequent agreements made pursuant to this Agreement;
- (g) structures and other arrangements through which subagreements entered into pursuant to this Agreement may be implemented;
- (h) training;
- (i) provisions of a framework agreement and implementation strategy;
- (j) ratification criteria;
- (k) funding and funding arrangements;
- (1) short-term and long-term timeframes;
- (m) public announcements related to this Agreement and any subagreements made pursuant hereto; and
- (n) any other matter agreed to by the Parties.

- Fisheries management discussions referred to in paragraph 3.1 (b) include the following fisheries related issues:
 - (a) conservation;
 - (b) protection and enhancement of salmon stocks and other species of fish and marine life;
 - (c) enumeration and monitoring, including stock assessment, data gathering, analysis, management and exchange of information;
 - (d) habitat protection and enhancement;
 - (e) harvesting, including who can fish; when, where, how and how much they can fish and disposition;
 - (f) the management of fishing by the Constituents;
 - (g) short-term and long-term planning;
 - (h) management plans and a process for updating and adjusting such plans as required during a fishery;
 - (i) pre-season and in-season dispute settlement mechanisms;
 - (j) pilot projects; and
 - (k) evaluation and feedback mechanisms.

4.0 Participation of User Groups

- 4.1 All user groups, both native and non-native, will be asked to participate in allocation discussions.
- 5.0 <u>Discussion Process</u>
- 5.1 DFO agrees to enter into discussions with CSTC and any agreements reached as a result of such discussions will be between DFO and CSTC, or one or more Constituents or structures or arrangements referred to in paragraph 3.1(g) of this Agreement.
- 5.2 Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement; it is understood that each Constituent may pursue discussions directly with DFO within the context of a time frame agreed upon by DFO and the said Constituent.
- 6.0 <u>Other Federal Departments</u>
- 6.1 DFO and CSTC agree to keep relevant federal departments advised of the status and nature of any discussions referred to herein.
 - 7.0 <u>Ratification</u>
 - 7.1 Execution of this Agreement by DFO, CSTC and the Constituents shall constitute ratification.
 - 7.2 The representatives of the CSTC warrant that they execute this Agreement on behalf of CSTC and have authority to bind CSTC.
 - 7.3 The representatives of the Constituents warrant that they execute this Agreement on behalf of the Constituents and have authority to bind the Constituents.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This agreement made this 16th day of February, 1990, between:

The Natoot'en, represented by Chief Wilf Adam;

The Carrier - Sekani Tribal Council, represented by Joseph P. Michell, Tribal Chief;

The Gitksan Wet'suwet'en Hereditary Chiefs, represented by each House group signing; and,

The Tsimshian Tribal Council, represented by Alex Bolton

(Hereinafter, in this Agreement, the Natoot'en, the Carrier - Sekani Tribal Council, The Gitksan Wet'suwet'en Hereditary Chiefs and the Tsimshian Tribal Council are referred to as the "First Nations".)

DISCLAIMER

This Agreement is designed solely to promote the exchange of information and cooperation on fisheries and resource management issues between the First Nations of the Skeena Watershed. All agreements whether expressly stated or implied herein are <u>without</u> <u>prejudice</u> to the aboriginal rights and unsettled claims of each First Nation. There is no intention by any one of the First Nations to infringe on the aboriginal rights and claims of any of the others. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, this Agreement is <u>without prejudice</u> to any rights which may inure to the benefit of the Natoot'en from the <u>Barricades Agreement</u> of <u>1906</u>.

WHEREAS: Each First Nation has an aboriginal right to fish for social, ceremonial and economic purposes; and,

WHEREAS: Each First Nation continues to depend on the fisheries resource as a mainstay of their economic, social and cultural well-being; and,

WHEREAS: The aboriginal right to fish supercedes all other fisheries and is limited only by the need for proper conservation of threatened fish stocks; and, WHEREAS: The First Nations on the Skeena Watershed are the <u>Guardians of the Source</u> with specific responsibility for the protection of the resource on whose continued wellbeing all three nations depend; and,

NOW , THEREFORE, THE FIRST NATIONS AGREE ON THESE PRINCIPLES:

1. To protect the source according to traditional law.

2. To conserve the resource according to traditional law.

3. To harvest the resource according to traditional law.

THE PARTIES AGREE FURTHER, AND MORE SPECIFICALLY, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. To cooperate in the development of a comprehensive, long-term fisheries management plan for the Skeena watershed as the first step towards an <u>Integrated Resource Management Plan</u>.
- 2. To avail, in the short-term, of the moneys received from the departments of Indian Affairs and Fisheries and Oceans to set up a representative core group to pursue the comprehensive planning initiative.
- 3. To seek avenues for self-financing and local control of all initiatives undertaken cooperatively by the First Nations of the Skeena watershed.
